Applications for the Autumn Term 2018. Children whose fifth birthday occurs between 1 September 2013 and 31st August 2014. Applications must be made to County Hall by 15th January 2017. You can apply online at:

Children start in our Foundation Stage and move into Key Stage One for two years (Years One and Two). At seven they move into Key Stage Two (Years Three to Six) before moving onto High School at age 11.

Catchment Area

Husbands Bosworth's catchment area includes the village of Husbands Bosworth initially and depending on numbers may form a wider area to include neighbouring villages.

Priority Criteria

If there are too many requests, priority will be given to children in the appropriate age-range, whose parents applied on time, in the following order:

If there are too many requests, priority will be given to children, whose parents applied on time, in the following order (see note i below):-

1 st	Children who are in public care and those children who were previously looked after children. (See note ii.)
2 nd	Pupils who live in the catchment area. (See note iii.)
3 rd	Pupils who will have an older brother or sister attending the same school at the same time. (See notes iv and v.)
4 th	Pupils who have a serious medical condition or exceptional social or domestic needs that make it essential they attend the school requested. (Professional documentation confirming the situation must be submitted with the application.) (See note vi.)
5 th	Pupils who will have attended a feeder school for at least two years before the time of transfer. (See note vii)
6 th	Pupils starting at an infant school with a sibling attending at the same time in the linked junior school (see note iv.) or Pupils transferring to high school who will have an older brother or sister attending the linked upper school at the same time. (See note iv.)
7 th	Pupils basing their application on grounds of 'belief'. (See note viii.)
8 th	Pupils living nearest to the school measured in a straight line distance (home to school front gate). (See note ix.)
