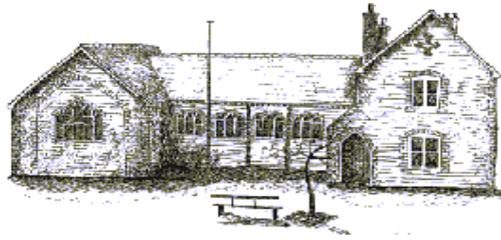

Vision Statement

Our vision is as follows:

'Learning together to achieve our dreams' is the vision and challenge we set for all our children, families, staff and governors. We aim to provide the children with a curriculum that is engaging and purposeful. We want our pupils to be knowledgeable, well-rounded and confident children who are aware of and make a positive contribution to their community – 'love your neighbour' (Matthew 22:39). By offering an environment that is safe, caring and supportive we provide the conditions for all to flourish, challenging everyone to be the best that they can be: the person God created them to be. This is in keeping with our Trust's core purpose – learning, and core value – fellowship.

This vision, alongside the school's values of being Ready, Responsible and Respectful, have helped to shape this policy to ensure the best outcomes for all stakeholders.

Role of Parents

All parents who send their children to Husbands Bosworth C of E Primary School are expected to adhere to the school's uniform policy. Parents should ensure their child has the correct school uniform and that it is clean and well presented.

Non-compliance with Uniform Policy

Where there is a problem with compliance parents should inform school as soon as possible and explain the issue. There are occasionally reasons why the uniform policy is not being followed and parents can expect a sympathetic and helpful response.

Non-compliance sanctions:

- If a child is not wearing their hair tied back they will be provided with the means to do this.
- Additional items of clothing / jewellery will need to be removed.
- Call to parents to request uniform to be brought into school

After school clubs may require specific items of clothing, for example trainers. If a child is not able to take part in an after-school activity because they do not have the necessary kit parents will be called to either provide the kit or collect the child. We are not able to provide alternative arrangements during an extra-curricular activity.

Aims and Objectives

It is school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school organised event outside normal school hours.

The policy for school uniform is based on the notion that it:-

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- generates a sense of community and belonging toward the school;

- is practical and smart;
- is designed with consideration of health and safety.

The school uniform policy is an integral part of the school's commitment to equality and inclusion. The governing body believes the school uniform policy allows all pupils to establish a shared identity and celebrate what they have in common, whilst respecting diversity.

Uniform

Long grey trousers or Grey A-line or pleated skirt / pinafore of reasonable length

White or blue polo shirt

Burgundy school sweatshirt (with school logo are available to order)

Burgundy fleece (with school logo are available to order)

Red and White checked summer dress.

Grey or black socks or grey tights or plain white or grey socks.

Black school shoes – No Trainers or Boots unless inclement weather

HAIR

Long hair should be tied back at all times.

P.E. KIT

To consist of:

- Pair of conventional navy blue shorts
- Navy blue tracksuit or jogging bottoms.
- White crew neck T- Shirt
- Plimsolls for indoor PE
- Trainers for outdoor PE.

Some after school clubs may require additional kit for example shin pads are essential for football club. Any additional kit will be indicated on a separate letter to parents.

P.E. KIT TO BE KEPT IN A P.E. BAG

JEWELLERY AND MAKE UP

Children must not wear makeup or nail polish. Earrings should be of a stud variety and will need to be removed or covered before PE and swimming. Children will need to manage this independently. No other jewellery should be worn. A watch is not considered to be jewellery.

NAMING OF UNIFORM AND LOST PROPERTY

Please make sure that all your child's clothes are clearly marked, preferably with name tapes. Shoes, plimsolls and trainers should also have names written inside. The school will endeavor to reunite lost named items with their owners. Unnamed lost property will be disposed of at the end of each term.
