Our school is based on two sites. The younger children are based in the 'Field Rooms', which gives them access to the large outside area as well as having modern classrooms and facilities. Both sites have access to the internet and banks of laptops to use to support the curriculum.

COMMUNITY

The school is supported by its local community. Friends of Husbands Bosworth run a variety of events in order to raise funds for the school, our governors volunteer to support the school in its continued development. We use the local facilities such as the village hall and tennis courts to help with our curriculum offer and our strong link with All Saints church means we take part in services and events as well as supporting them with fund raising.



WIDER CURRICULUM OPPORTUNITIES

We provide after school sports clubs in netball, football, multi skills and cross country. Other clubs include chess, art and crafts and board games. All children in KS2 have the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument such as brass or violin.

HOT SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are offered to all children in Foundation Stage and Years 1 and 2 under the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meals programme.
